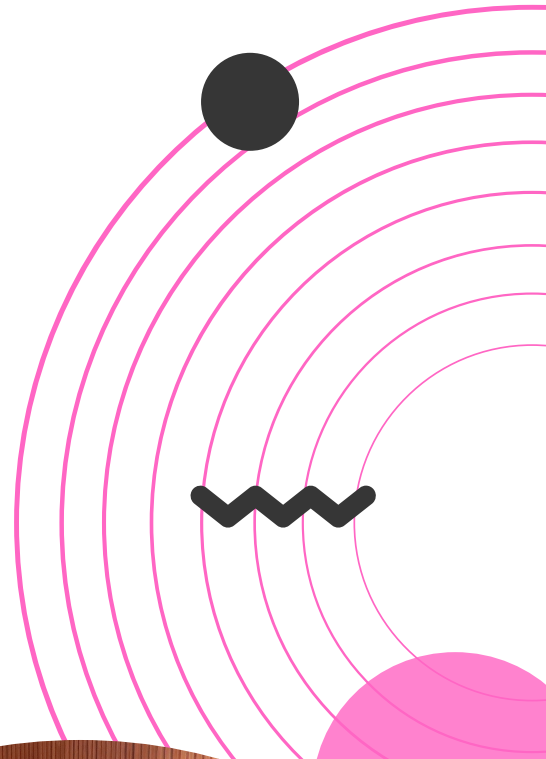

## TO DREAM AND FOLLOW YOUR OWN WAYS

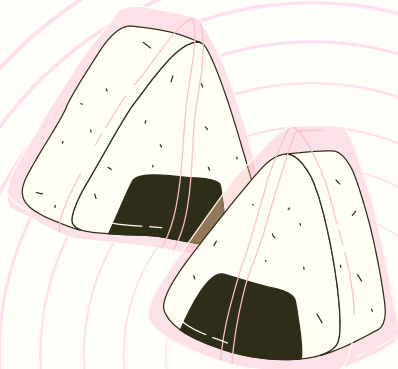

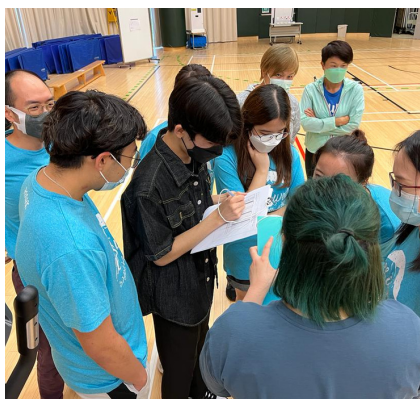
